

Dear Parents,

I am writing to inform you of the Governing Body's decision, following the consultation period, on the proposed changes to the school day timings for September 2017.

Firstly, I would like to thank everyone who responded to the consultation letter in writing, giving your viewpoint and providing the valuable feedback that I needed to be as fully informed as possible so that I could give an accurate account to governors to help in the decision making process. Also, I would like to thank the parents who attended the open meeting to discuss the proposal, providing your views on the positive and negative aspects of the proposal and asking many important questions to give me 'food for thought' from a parents perspective. I found both the written responses and the meeting very important in this process, so thank you.

We have 175 families in our school and 210 children. Out of those 175 families, I had 62 responses in total. Out of those 62 responses, 48 were 'in favour' of the proposal or 'happy either way' and only 14 responses were 'against' the proposal.

The main issues raised and points that people were concerned about were:

- Those children who are slow eaters would be rushed to eat their lunch if dinner time was reduced by 5 minutes.
- Parents having to change their working hours to enable them to pick their child up at 2 pm on a Friday.
- Worries over childcare provision and additional costs.
- Curriculum coverage; are the children going to miss out on anything?
- A drop in attainment and academic standards as there is a slight reduction in the Junior timings.
- Changing the 'Celebration Assembly' time to the afternoon will mean some parents cannot attend.
- The quality of provision for the teaching of Music & PE if the expertise we currently pay for is removed.

All of the above points were discussed, at length, by the Governing Body of the school in a meeting this week. I am confident that all of these points raised can be addressed in a way that will please those with these concerns. I can assure parents there will be no drop in standards or quality of provision, no child will be rushed at lunch, the 'Celebration Assembly' may be changed but parents will be given plenty of notice to attend, no parent should have to change their working hours and any changes to childcare provision and costs will be minimal.

Following the discussion it has been decided that we will change the timings of the school day meaning that school will close at 2 pm on Friday, starting in September 2017.

I understand that this was not what everyone wanted and that some of you will be concerned but taking everything into consideration it was felt that this would be the best outcome for the school and for the majority of our parents.

If there are any parents with extenuating circumstances who cannot collect their child at 2 pm on a Friday, please contact me confidentially, to arrange a time to meet with me, to see if I can help in any way. Thanks again for your continued support.
