



Proposed changes to the school day for September 2017 Notification of Stakeholders and Consultation Opening

Dear Parents.

I am writing this letter to you to read, take in and provide you with the time and opportunity to respond.

In a response to the Government funding cuts to School Budget for next year, I am looking at ways of making savings on my current expenditure and one of the ideas I am proposing is to eliminate the cost of cover for teachers during their Planning, Preparation & Assessment (PPA) time, which they are legally entitled to but it comes at a considerable cost to school as the children still need to be taught during this time.

Currently, I employ a sports company to deliver high quality P.E. sessions across the school and a music specialist to teach music across the school and take hymn practice. This costs the school £18,057.60 per year. Unfortunately, this does not cover all of the PPA required; Mrs Calvert-Lyons and I also have to spend some time covering so that the teachers get their full PPA entitlement and the children receive their full educational entitlement. This takes us away from the leadership responsibilities we have which is not ideal.

My plan is to make changes to the timings of the school days so that:

- no child misses out on any valuable learning time,
- all teachers get their PPA without the need for cover,
- the school makes the financial savings necessary to keep the school functioning efficiently to provide the best education possible for our children,
- hopefully I don't need to look at reducing contracted hours of staff or even making redundancies (Long term)

I am proposing that we finish school earlier on a Friday, at 2.00 pm, to eliminate the need for PPA cover which will mean we make considerable financial savings without reducing the amount of time spent teaching each week. I would like to start the school day **5 minutes** earlier, reduce lunchtime by **5 minutes** and then add **5 minutes** onto the end of the day (Monday to Thursday) so that the children receive the same quality of education that they receive now. Please see the table below for more details.

I understand that this may seem like quite a drastic measure in order to save money which is why I am giving you all as much information as possible to help you understand why I am making such a proposal.

I have consulted the Local Authority about this and they have informed me that a number of schools are making similar proposals so we are not the only school considering this.

I have checked the Government Department for Education (DfE) guidance on the necessary process on making such changes. There is a process to follow which includes:

- a meeting with the Governors to discuss the proposal,
- notification to stakeholders (parents, staff, etc,..) of the proposal,
- a period of consultation where stakeholders have the opportunity to respond to the proposal in writing,
- a second meeting with Governors to discuss the responses to the proposal and then make an informed final decision on whether to make the change or not.

I have also checked the Government Department for Education (DfE) guidance on suggested recommendations of learning time for the various ages of the children to ensure the children receive their full entitlement and we are over those timings recommended for Early Years Foundation Stage, Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 so there will be no loss of learning time or problem legally.

I understand that some parents will not be able to pick their child up at 2.00 pm on a Friday due to work commitments. I am going to be in a position to offer child care from 2.00 - 3.15 pm through Leading Light Club for a certain number of children, for a minimal cost, until those parents who would normally collect at 3.15 pm can make it to school. Those parents who always use Leading Light Club on a Friday would continue as they are now where the children will be cared for up until 5.45 pm for the usual cost with a little addition to cover the costs of 2.00 - 3.15 pm.

I am actively looking at alternatives to this proposal so nothing has been decided at this stage of the process. I am looking for your feedback, whether in favour of the proposal or against so that I can be as fully informed as possible before any decision is made.

I will be holding an open meeting for all parents on **Tuesday** 6th **June 2017** at **6.30 pm** to discuss the proposal further; explaining myself as clearly as I can and listening to feedback from whoever attends.

In the meantime, please fill in the feedback form attached, giving details of your support or concerns, returning it to school after the half-term holiday before the consultation closing date of Friday 23rd June 2017. This gives a consultation period of 4 weeks for me to receive your responses.

I urge you to consider your responses carefully and not just dismiss this as change for the sake of change. I do feel that there could be certain advantages to parents and families here too. I have a lot of parents asking to collect their child early on a Friday to go away for the weekend in order to beat the traffic. Parents could also arrange medical appointments for Friday afternoons as after 2.00 pm would no longer be considered school hours.

I look forward to your responses.
