





Following our Teacher Training Day on Tuesday where we have been looking at ways of improving outcomes for all pupils, particularly in writing, we have decided to trial a new morning routine starting from next week on Monday 28th January 2019.

The gates will be open at 8.40 am as normal but from now on, the children will come straight into their classroom so that they can have a go at a SODA (Start Of Day Activity) CHALLENGE where they work independently to complete a task without too much teacher input. They will be supervised by their class teacher but complete the challenge themselves. So the children will not be outside on the playground in the morning, they will hang their coats and bags up and get into class to complete their SODA task straight away.

We feel that this will bring a number of benefits for the pupils as they:

- will be able to settle down to work much quicker so no valuable learning time will be lost.
- will develop their independent learning skills; doing things for themselves.
- will grow an inner resilience to face challenges and succeed on their own.
- will improve their basic literacy skills which will have a positive impact on English work in class.
- will get into the right mind-set for their day of learning quicker.
- will not be suffering any playground related injuries first thing.

The gates will close at 8.50 am as normal and I am not saying that the children have to be in school any earlier however, they will miss out on their SODA challenge or have less time to complete it if they are not here before 8.50 am or are late. I am really excited by this new initiative and I know that the children will enjoy it too.
