## Pupil Premium Report

2018-2019



### Allocation

The government has allocated a specific pupil premium grant to every school to ensure children from low income families and vulnerable children have the best possible chance to succeed. The funding in 2018-2019 was £1320 for every child eligible for Free School meals, £300 for a Child of a Parent in the Services and £980 for a Looked After Child. SS Peter & Paul's allocation for the period April 2018 to March 2019 was **£37,220** and in 2019-2020 is predicted to be more at £39,900.

At SS Peter & Paul our decisions on how this money is spent focus on ensuring all of our children achieve the highest of academic standards, make outstanding progress, enjoy school and all that it has to offer and are able to **'Live and learn in the light of Christ'**. We believe that we are becoming more successful at achieving this, because despite the fact that the majority of our children enter the school well, below the national average, they leave the school at the end of KS2 at or just below the national average.

### Impact Statement

- Number of children achieving GLD at the end of EYFS (0%) 0 out of 2 Below National 56%
- Children passing the Year 1 Phonics Screening Test (50%) 1 out of 2 Below National 70%
- Reading at Key Stage 1 (67%) 2 out of 3 Above National 63%
- Writing at Key Stage 1 (67%) 2 out of 3 Above National 54%
- Maths at Key Stage 1 (67%) 2 out of 3 Above National 62%
- Reading at Key Stage 2 (80%) 4 out of 5 Above National 60%
- Writing at Key Stage 2 (40%) 2 out of 5 Below National 66%
- Maths at Key Stage 2 (80%) 4 out of 5 Above National 63%

There is still work to do ensuring our disadvantaged pupils attain as well, if not better than, all children. The attainment of our disadvantaged pupils remains a priority. In 2019-2020 we have been awarded £39,900 Pupil Premium funding; this will be spent on closing the gaps that exist and continually ensuring our children maintain the very highest of educational standards. We will build upon the successes of 2018-2019 to ensure the highest quality teaching, providing a range of individual programmes to support learning, to include focused teaching in Reading, Writing, Phonics and Maths. We will ensure that our best and most experienced teachers spend time teaching. We will structure our use of teaching assistants for targeted intervention strategies, in order to maximise opportunities for learning. We will operate a system of corrective intervention so that no child falls behind. We will also provide a wide range of activities to develop all round learners and extend the school day. We will subsidise school trips where necessary. Our focus will continue to be ensuring all children receive quality first teaching, particularly those with special educational needs. Above all else we will ensure that every moment that they spend in school will be focused upon enabling them to ***‘Live and learn in the light of Christ’***.
