

Dear Parent/Carer,

Important – Proposed School Funding Changes and how you can help.

You may have seen or read about the ongoing situation with school funding on the news recently so I am writing to update you on how these issues impact upon our school.

For many years, schools around the country have been funded at different levels. This has resulted in some schools receiving more and some receiving less money. Therefore, the Government is planning a move towards a National Funding Formula (NFF) which means that funds are spread evenly regardless of where you are based in the country. Whilst we agree that this is a fairer way to fund schools, what is clear is that the Government does not have enough money in the system for this to happen without many schools losing out.

In addition to the changes being made to the way funding is allocated to schools there are many other pressures facing our school budget at this time. National Insurance and Pension contributions are increasing resulting in greater staff costs. Just like at home, utilities and other goods and services that we buy, are also increasing. Our budget however is remaining static (reducing in real terms) which is putting a strain on our finances. Also the Government are imposing a tax on organisations from April 2017 requiring us to pay a percentage of our budget back into a pot known as the 'Apprenticeship Levy'. This amounts to 0.5% of our budget which may not sound like a lot but is another additional pressure. This will have a negative impact on our annual budget by 2019 in real terms unless the proposed policy is changed. To put this into perspective, the reduction will seriously affect our ability to continue with staffing levels as they are now and provide resources for the children. It is also important to highlight that schools are already operating in a significantly more challenging financial position than we were prior to the economic crash in 2008.

Following the link under the section 'Get Involved' you can add your own details that will generate a petition letter to email to Mr Jack Dromey MP asking him what he is doing to protect schools in the area and also sign the petition which has been set up. You will need to give your full name and address, as MP's can only deal with matters raised by their own constituents.

I am sorry if this letter makes for some difficult reading however I feel it is important to let you know of the challenges we face at school with regards to funding so you can better understand what is happening. Please support this cause for your children and make your voice heard!
