Punctuality – School starts at 8.50 am & closes at 3.20 pm Monday to Thursday. Every Friday it's open 8.50 am to 2.00 pm. Punctuality is important to ensure a good school day for both children and staff. **Security** – Once children have been dropped off at school they must not, under any circumstances, leave the school premises for reasons of Safeguarding. Pupil absence - If your child is absent from school please remember to phone school before 9.30 am. & send a note in when your child returns. **Uniform** – Please ensure that **ALL** school uniform is clearly labelled with vour child's name.

Dinner money – Please note this will increase to £2.35 per day (£11.75 per week) with effect from 30th April 2019. Please remember we are now 'Cashless' so all dinner money payments must be made via ParentMail.

School Dinners – If your child changes their meal pattern from School dinners to packed lunch or swap from pizza day to packed lunch we must insist on half a terms notice. Thank you.







- Those areas which were highlighted as areas for improvement are:
- Better communication with parents
- Improved attitude to a healthy lifestyle as there are too many sweet treats on offer as either a reward or for sale via the SPFA after school on Friday's. We need healthier options and choices.
- A feeling that there has been an increase in negative consequences and negative language in school, particularly in the new 'Non-negotiables'
- Not all teachers are approachable and parents only see the teacher when things go wrong or for negative behaviour reasons.
