



## Proposed changes to the school day for September 2017 Open Meeting for Parents

Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> June @ 6.30 pm

## Minutes of Meeting

NP welcomed everyone and thanked them for attending. NP explained the format of the meeting, the reasons behind calling the meeting and that he was open to any advice, suggestions or ideas to help improve the situation either with or without making changes to the school day. This is supposed to be an open process and I'd rather know what peoples true feelings are and the difficulties this will make so that I'm as fully informed as possible going forward.

It has been well publicised in the media that the government is making massive cuts to school budgets across the country, we are not the only ones affected but I need to start thinking of ways to save money. Our school budget is very tight for next year, pretty much breaking even to the penny, maybe even a slight deficit. The only reason we are going to be breaking even is because we're losing 3 part-time members of staff (AB, JK & SU), plus 2 members of staff are reducing their contracted hours of employment (AL & CO). We have made savings this year already as EC-L & NP have been doing some PPA cover for teachers and TA's have been doing short-term cover for staff illness or absence. The problem is there is no contingency money to pay for any long-term illnesses or maternities that may occur next year which would/could send us deep into a deficit budget.

We have been looking at ways of reducing expenditure. PPA cover costs were an obvious one to start with.

A parent asked: What PPA was and why it costs money? I explained that teachers are legally entitled to 10% release time to help with their Planning Preparation and Assessment for the children in their class. It costs money because I have to pay someone to teach those children while their teacher isn't with them. This year that has meant paying for a sports company to deliver PE sessions and a music teacher to teach music for 3 afternoons a week.

The next area we could look to make savings is by losing additional/extra support services like; our family support worker, educational psychology service, after school clubs, life education service, gifted and talented workshops, fit4schools, etc,... these are things we pay for because we feel they're important for our children but they would have to go.

Following that, we would have to look at losing essential support services like dinner ladies, office staff and/or teaching assistants. All of these have essential roles which, if removed, would have a massive impact on the workload of the teachers and the children's learning. The knock on effect would mean that roles carried out by these staff; boosting children who are struggling, small group interventions, targeted support for SEN children, hearing children read, spending time talking to vulnerable children who need support, etc,... would fall onto the teachers workload or just not get done! My aim is to ensure all of the existing staff stay in post to ensure the school can continue to function at its current level of effectiveness.

NP explained that teachers and TA's are given PPA time together as they are a partnership who work together to get ready for future learning. Plus the TA's need to know what is going on for the times they are taking small groups or covering the class for a short while when the teacher isn't there.

To try and allay some general concerns NP explained that the timetable will be restructured to off-set any loss of learning time. It will take a big change of mind-set for staff, parents and pupils as we step away from our traditional 4 lessons a day model. There would be no loss in quality of education as the PE and Music would be taught by the class teachers and any professional development would be provided. We would alter our use of Sports Premium money to incorporate team teaching of PE and learning from a subject specialist through the Kingsbury Sports Partnership which we already buy into so not costing anything extra. The creative subjects would continue to be taught as part of the working week in school. Swimming would be moved to a different day and we may look at the way the children are selected to go swimming as not all children need to go if they can already swim to a certain standard. So we wouldn't lose out on anything time wise, curriculum wise and content wise.

A parent then asked: What does the timetable look like now and could we see a comparison of what the new timetable will look like? I explained I would put together a comparative timetable as an example. A good idea.

NP then explained the benefits to behaviour as most of the issues we deal with are during the times when the class teacher is not with the children during PPA. Behaviour would improve as the children would consistently have their class teacher or TA throughout the whole week. After school clubs would still go ahead but they would have to be paid for by the parents. Irish dancing could still go ahead on a Friday; I would just investigate whether the time could be brought forward.

NP explained that he understood the downside to this proposal is the impact on parents with regards to childcare and the additional financial costs involved. To try and off-set this, I can offer childcare from 2 pm at a minimal cost (if any) to any parent who cannot pick their child up at the new end of school day time. I am looking to use Leading Light Club staff, plus I have a few ideas for use of the school hall and playground to provide additional play based care until the existing pick up time of 3.15 pm. I would need to assess numbers that would be affected by this if or when the decision has been finalised.

I do understand people's concerns but I have to try and do what is best for the children, staff and school as a whole so that everyone gets the best possible education at this school now and for many years to come. I have to take a long term view and try and see a bigger picture including the future of the school, not just the here and now.

I am actively looking for alternatives; this is not a 'done deal' by any stretch of the imagination which is why it has gone out to parents for consultation. I am looking for additional funding opportunities to increase the budget and alternative methods of covering PPA without the need to make these changes. I am aware that lots of other schools are investigating this as a possibility – Pupil and School Support advised me on this and the process.

NP then asked for any comments, thoughts and suggestions on anything they've heard or anything they are unsure about.

**Parents said:** Is there a possibility of opening the school earlier in the morning then childcare costs could be off-set or even reduced for parents. Would it be more productive and conducive to learning as the children will be fresher earlier in the morning? NP said this is something he'd thought about but that would require further consultation as some families would struggle to get to school earlier.

**Parents said:** The biggest impact will be financial, especially for those with more than one child. Having to find and then pay for additional childcare will be significantly more expensive over time! NP agreed that this is the biggest challenge and he was doing everything he could to ensure the cost (if any) would be minimal.

**Parent said:** What about celebration assembly? NP said that the idea is to move celebration assembly to the afternoon 1.15 - 1.45 pm but understood that this may be difficult for some parents to attend. I will look at ways of improving communication so parents know exactly what award their child is getting so they can then assess the need to attend or not.

**Parent said:** Have you thought about informing your prospective parents starting in Reception Class in September 2017? NP said it was going to an item on the agenda for the new parents' induction meeting next week. I will keep them as informed as I can of any changes and decisions made.

**Parent said:** What about the crossing lady? Can she work at 2 pm instead of 3.15 pm to help families? NP said that was something he hadn't considered but would look into it. Thank you for bringing it to my attention.

Parent said: I am concerned about the impact of the foundation subjects, the more creative ones as we would be losing 1 ½ hours learning time, plus any loss in quality and expertise by subjects being taught by non-specialist teachers. NP assured that all creative/foundation subjects would continue to be taught and any subject specialism I can tap into, I would look to get involved with. Any CPD (Continual Professional Development) opportunities would be encouraged and undertaken. Parent suggested links with local secondary schools and any universities. NP agreed these were good avenues to investigate and would follow them up.

Parent expressed concern at the possible additional cost to after school clubs and the fact that it will become a case that those who can afford it will benefit and those who can't, won't. I hadn't taken this into consideration but promise that all children would still have the same opportunities to participate as we have Pupil Premium funding available to pay for those who can't pay for it. However, there is a difference between can't and won't pay.

**Parent said:** Have you spoken to any other schools that have done this to find out the impact and response? NP: I have spoken to one head of a local school who are doing this from September 2017 and all of their feedback from parents is hugely positive as they get to go away for weekends earlier and avoid traffic, book appointments for doctors and dentists, start the weekend earlier, etc,... But I know that there is another school who have been doing this for years, I know the head and will phone her to see what the impact and feedback has been like.

**Parent suggestion:** To help solve the childcare issue could you not have a cinema club in the hall where some parents or staff could volunteer to supervise the children from 2 - 3.15 pm? NP said that was a good suggestion and he was looking at alternative ways of supervising those that can't be collected.

**Parent asked:** What is the likelihood of me changing things again in the near future should more budget cuts come in? What is the longevity of this decision? NP said that this plan would be in place for the foreseeable future as it would save school £18,000+ each year so there should be no need to make any further changes. The budget cuts are scheduled until 2020 so my plan is to keep any changes the same until the budget levels out. If the budget cuts are reversed then I would look to reverse the changes and get things back to how they were.

NP explained that the consultation process would continue until Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> June and then the responses would be collated, reviewed and then brought to governors for a meeting where a final decision would be reached so we can inform the parents as soon as possible.

The meeting was closed at 7.45 pm.
